## 2021 Budget Out

Hello Friends and Clients!

Chrystia Freeland's first budget projects is as disastrous as expected with deep deficits for years to come perpetuating the pandemic crisis and wasting more on the green economy. While there are some tax breaks, we'll pay for all of it down the road as our economy still struggles. National Post sums it this way, *"The new spending plunges Canada further into debt, with a \$154.7 billion deficit forecast for this year and a deficit over \$50 billion forecast for the two following years"*. Here is some of the main points as outlined from the National Post:

- Luxury sales tax on cars and personal aircraft worth over \$100,000 and boats over \$250,000.
- A new one per cent tax on the value of non-resident, non-Canadian owned residential real estate that is considered to be vacant or under used.
- A new Digital Services Tax that would apply to the revenue earned by technology giants such as Facebook or Google off of Canadian users (for example, revenue from the ads that are served to Canadian users).
- Establishing a minimum wage of \$15-per-hour for federally regulated workplaces such as banks, airlines and the telecom sector.
- Increasing Old Age Security benefits for seniors age 75 and older by providing a onetime payment of \$500 in August and then a permanent 10 per cent increase to benefits starting in July 2022.
- Adding \$2.5 billion and reallocating \$1.3 billion in existing funding to speed up the construction, repair, or support of 35,000 affordable housing units.
- Adding \$5 billion over seven years to the Net Zero Accelerator, giving it a total of \$8 billion to give to projects that help reduce domestic greenhouse gas emissions.


