logging into your <u>CRA Account</u> or <u>My Service Canada Account</u>. Essentially, <u>eligible persons</u> will get \$2,000 per month up to 4 months if they are out of work from COVID-19. You'll find details on this and more from the <u>Knowledge Bureau</u>, and <u>details of the 75% Employer Wage Subsidy</u>. 
2020 Federal Budget Still to Come?

CRA Ombudsman Makes 15 Recommendations to Speed Things Up


A recent <u>Knowledge Bureau article</u> summarized the <u>CRA</u> <u>Ombudsman's</u> overview of tax professionals' and taxpayers' feedback. The bottom line is that it takes too long to perform certain tasks and returns, such as:

- Returns where the CRA must contact an individual for more information
- Multiple tax years filed at the same time
- Returns for deceased persons
- Returns for bankrupt persons
- Returns for international and non-resident individuals
- Returns for emigrants

2020 Tax Filing Deadline

Normally, the deadline would be 25 days from now, but this year CRA has extended the deadline to Monday, June 1, 2020, for 2019 returns. While this provides some relief for most personal returns, I don't



recommend waiting to get your taxes done, especially if you need them assessed soon. Once you're ready to file your 2019 return, plan TODAY rather than later. I am jammed to the rafters with appointments, and you may have to wait weeks before getting in. Take advantage of our email, fax, phone, or mail service. Make sure you <u>authorize us</u> if you haven't already done so or you are a new client. The days of office locations and 9–5 hours are a thing of the past, and regrettably businesses stuck in yesterday's ways will get left there. Most clients are demanding more options, and—no surprise—appointments are no longer necessary!

New Credits, Benefits, and Services for Your 2019 Personal Taxes

Every year there are several new changes and/or additions to the tax



code. Most don't affect the average filer immediately, but the CRA recently listed the <u>highlights of changes and benefits</u> that filers may be interested in. The <u>list of tips</u> includes filing <u>your</u> <u>own taxes for free, improved online access to your tax,</u> <u>benefit, and social security information</u>, acceptance of <u>payment arrangements</u>, <u>Auto-fill</u>, and getting <u>free filing</u> <u>services</u>. Should I Wait to File Past April 30 This Year?

Real People with Real Questions About Real Situations



Dear Neel,

I just got laid off due to COVID-19 and can't pay my accountant. I'm broke but expecting a refund as always. Is it a good idea to wait to file, since the deadline is now a month later?

Dear Kelly,

It's not illegal to file at the deadline, but I'm not a fan of waiting to the last minute since you never know what can change in this environment. Rule modifications can sometimes work against you, so here are a few recommendations.

First, apply for the <u>Canada Emergency Response Benefit</u> by logging into your <u>CRA Account</u> or <u>My Service Canada Account</u>. The initial payment of \$2,000 should be in your bank before the end of April. Second, ask for payment options from your accountant. Usually, you can defer or discount the price. I'm not sure if you qualify for the free <u>Tax Volunteer Program</u>, but that's another option.

Lastly, see if you can defer your rent, mortgage, or any other debts. Creditors are more than willing to work with you, and some banks are offering as much as 6 months of relief. This is a very rare "debtor's market," so bargain while the sun's shining. Hope this helps!
