


RRSP Deadline Approaching!

This year's contribution deadline is Wednesday, March 01st, 2023 for your 2022 income tax return. If you miss the deadline, you can always use it for your 2023 return. You should make sure you



have relevant information like your contribution room, Home Buyer/Lifelong Learning Plan repayment requirements, and so forth. A <u>recent article by Financial Post's Jamie Golombek</u> explains overcontributions scenarios, etc. *"The amount you can contribute to a combination of your RRSP and/or a spousal RRSP is based purely on your own RRSP limit"* explains Golombek. claims depending on the situation. Here is a breakdown of:

The Temporary Flat Rate Method

<u>This new method</u> will simplify the claim for home office expenses. The maximum that can be claimed using the new temporary flat rate method is \$400 (200 working days) per individual and employers will NOT be required to complete and sign form T2200/<u>T2200S</u> and employees will NOT be required to keep documents to support the expense claim.

Each employee working from home who meets the eligibility criteria can use the temporary flat rate method. That is, the claim is not limited per household, but per qualifying employee. A day of part-time work also qualifies for the \$2/ day deduction.

This method cannot be used if the employee is also claiming other employment expenses such as automobile deductions, or if the employee was fully reimbursed for their home office expenses.

The \$2/day deduction cannot be claimed for vacation or sickness days or paid or unpaid leave.

The Detailed Method

The detailed method applies to employees working from home due to the Covid-19 pandemic or other employees who are required by the terms of their contract to work from home. With this method, an employee can claim the actual amounts paid, supported by documents. There are specific rules as to what is eligible to be claimed under the detailed method that is beyond the scope of this article.

Under the detailed method, an employer must also have completed and signed form <u>T2200S</u> or form T2200. The T2200 is the usual form that an employer would complete to certify a variety of employment related expenses which an employee was required to pay, and to indicate if any allowances were provided by the employer. The T2200S is a one-page, simplified version of the T2200, to be used for employees who worked from home due to the Covid-19 pandemic but who opt out of the flat rate method. The T2200S is simplified because the employer will only have to confirm that the employee worked at home due to the pandemic, whether they were reimbursed for home office costs, and whether those reimbursements are reported on the employee's T4.

The T2200S can **only** be used to justify claiming home office expenses. An employee wanting to claim motor vehicle expenses, tools, or other employment expenses will need the T2200 from their employer. For employees who rent rather than own their home, they will likely be better off using the detailed method rather than the flat rate method. Employers will have to consider whether they will produce and distribute T2200S forms for all employees who were working from home because of the pandemic, or only if requested by the employee.

New Home Renovation Tax Credit For This Year



Starting this year, you can now claim the Multi-generational Home Renovation Tax

<u>Credit</u> which is the lesser of 15% of eligible costs and \$50,000 for a maximum real dollar value of up to \$7500. A <u>qualifying</u> <u>individual</u> is an individual who is eligible for the <u>disability tax</u> <u>credit (DTC)</u> at any time in the year or an individual who is 65 years of age or older at the end of the year. Costs include labor, professional services, building materials/fixtures, equipment rentals, and permits. <u>Knowledge Bureau has an</u> <u>article on this for more details</u>.

More & Improved E-Services for 2022 Personal Returns



It is official. "E-File" starts first thing Monday, February 20th, 2023 for all 2022

personal returns. Most refunds are in 1-2 weeks, and I suggest you get direct deposit. Also, there are a <u>variety of slips now</u> <u>available on-line</u> as far back as 10 years with on-line mail, and now you can link between <u>My Account</u> and <u>My Service Canada</u> <u>Account</u> for more. When you file your return, simply take your banking information or a blank cheque and you can have your refund, GST Credit, and Child Benefits all done. If for some reason you forget, simply sign up for <u>Direct Deposit</u> with CRA, and they should be able to start right away. For further information contact general enquiries at 1-800-959-8281.

Now Here




The Government of Canada has introduced the <u>Underused Housing Tax</u>

Act (UHTA), which governs the underused housing tax and took effect on January 1, 2022. According to Video Tax, a 1% annual tax on the value of residential real estate considered to be vacant or underused that is owned on December 31 of each year. While the government indicated that the tax would target property owned by non-Canadians, the scope of filing requirements extends to many Canadian corporations and individuals, including CCPCs, trustees of a trust, and partners of a partnership. The first filings and taxes are due by May 1, 2023. Penalties for failure to file the return (even where no tax is payable) start at \$5,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for corporations. CNIL (Cumulative Net Investment Loss)

Few taxpayers familiar themselves with <u>CNIL (Cumulative Net Investment Loss)</u>, pronounced "senile," but in a nutshell it is a way to track the total amount of investment expenses that exceeds the total amount of investment income since 1987, if any. Ultimately, this calculation will be used to reduce the capital gains deduction a business owner may be eligible for <u>according to Knowledge Bureau</u>. The CNIL balance is the excess of your rental, interest, and investment losses over your rental, interest, and investment income. The tax-free portion of the gain will be reduced by the CNIL balance, thus turning an otherwise tax-free gain into a taxable gain.

CRA Shutting Down \$15 Billion in COVID Investigations

According to <u>The Globe and Mail</u>, Canada Revenue Agency Commissioner Bob Hamilton says it is not worth the effort to conduct a full review of more than \$15billion in pandemic wage benefits the



Auditor-General has said may have been sent to ineligible recipients. <u>Rebel News stated</u> Conservative MP Kelly McCauley also pushed back on the decision to disregard billions of dollars in overpayment and ineligibility. "This is a huge amount of potential money. Who in the CRA is making the decision that we're willing to risk writing off 15, 20, 25 billion dollars of taxpayers' money?" she asked.

As reported by <u>Blacklocks</u>, the total cost of the CEWS program was a staggering \$100.6 billion. Audits found the Canada Revenue Agency failed to make cursory checks on companies that applied for grants, the article reads.

Late Filers Miss Out on Billions in Refunds, Benefits, and More


