#### Valentine's Message

Dear Clients and Friends,

Welcome to 2024, and like you, I'm looking forward to a better one than the last. Lots has happened since the New Year, and as always, I will be here to bring you the "real news" through <u>newsletters</u>, bulletins, <u>Facebook</u>, and more. Hope y'all survived that January cold snap which brought -73F windchill temperatures in our province. Our website www.ptccanada.com has been established for over 25 years, which is quite an accomplishment in my industry, and it is there to keep you informed with the latest. Can you believe some accountants still do not have a website? How do they stay in business? Is World War III here? With recent bombings in Iran ,Yemen, and more, it's long been speculated the next global conflict would start in the Middle East. While that may almost sound prophetic, I'd need to first clarify what a war is. I believe we've been in an "information" war for longer than we can remember, and it's been intensifying since about 2016, becoming more noticeable in 2020. Alberta Premier Danielle Smith wasted no time responding: "Since day one, Alberta has been clear that the federal government's decision to invoke the Emergencies Act during the COVID-19 pandemic violated the constitutionally guaranteed rights of Albertans and gave the federal government the ability to seize property without due process of law." This has agreed with Board Certified Pathologist Dr. Roger <u>Hodkinson's</u> call for <u>retribution</u>: "<u>Hang them</u> high; I am vengeful and its time to put these bastards in jail. We have seen the biggest kill ever in medicine's history. Officials should be jailed for big kill caused by COVID jab, restrictions." ### RRSP Deadline Approaching!

This year's contribution deadline is Thursday, February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024, for your 2023 income tax return. If you miss the deadline, you can always use it for your 2024 return. You should make sure you

Recently, the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada <u>published a</u> <u>series of Q & As</u> from CRA. As of 2023,





## More & Improved E-Services for 2023 Personal Returns



It is official. "E-File" starts first thing
Monday, February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024, for all 2023 personal returns.
Most refunds are in 1-2 weeks, and I suggest you get direct deposit. Also, there are a <u>variety of slips now available on-line</u> as far back as 10 years with on-line mail, and now you can **link between My Account** and My Service Canada Account with more. When you file your return, simply take your banking information or a blank cheque and you can have your refund, GST Credit, and Child Benefits all done. If for some reason you forget, simply sign up for <u>Direct Deposit</u> with CRA and they should be able to start right away. For further information contact general enquiries at 1-800-959-8281.

# Tax Hikes Will Further Cripple the Middle Class in 2024





Trudeau will be <u>reaching deeper into your pockets</u> with payroll tax hikes, a carbon tax hike, and alcohol tax hikes. If you make \$73,200 or more, you'll be paying an extra \$347 in payroll taxes in 2024, for a total tax bill of \$5,104, while your employer will also be forced to fork over \$5,524 this year. #### **Reporting Crypto Transactions**

Since the last decade, there has been an increasing interest in Crypto currencies, and the trend will continue to grow. As a



result, the scrutiny from CRA has grown, so it's up to the taxpayer to report accordingly what's taxable. A <u>recent article from Knowledge Bureau</u> explains the details but the two main distinctions are buying and selling for gain/loss and mining for income. Buying and selling, like in stocks, usually qualify for <u>capital gains</u> taxed at a lower rate but mining is <u>considered a business</u> which allows deduction accordingly. ## Are Vacation Properties Exempt From the Underused Housing Tax (UHT)?

Housing Tax (UHT)?

Dear lan,

The new <u>Underused Housing Tax (UHT)</u> introduced last year has raised a lot of questions and confusion as to what's taxable or not. Traditionally, most vacation properties were exempt, but the rules as to what defines one were vague. For example, if a family had a main residence house in the city with a cottage in the country for many years, it was exempt. Under the UHT, the <u>Exemption for Vacation Properties</u> is much more clearly defined.

The CRA has developed an <u>Underused Housing Tax vacation</u> <u>property designation tool</u> to determine if your residential property is located in an eligible area of Canada for the purposes of this exemption. In a nutshell:

#### An eligible area is a place that is any of the following:

- outside both a census metropolitan area and a census agglomeration
- inside a census agglomeration that is not a specified census agglomeration
- inside a census metropolitan area or a specified census agglomeration but outside a population centre that is part of such an area or agglomeration.

You, or your spouse or common-law partner, personally use the residential property as a place of residence or lodging for at least 28 days in the calendar year.

Only affected owners who are individuals qualify for this exemption.

What are census metropolitan areas, census agglomerations, and population centres:

- Census metropolitan areas, census agglomerations, and population centres are statistical areas defined by Statistics Canada.
- Census metropolitan areas and census agglomerations are densely populated areas made up of adjacent municipalities that are economically and socially integrated.
- A census metropolitan area has a total population of at least 100,000 residents, of which 50,000 or more live in the core population centre.
- A census agglomeration has 10,000 or more residents living in the core population centre. For purposes of the exemption for vacation properties, a specified census agglomeration is a census agglomeration having a population of at least 30,000 residents.
- A population centre is an area that has a population of at least 1,000 residents and a population density of 400 persons or more per square kilometre.


