<u>Saturday</u> all year round thanks to a change in policy. There is now a "call back" option if the lineup is too long, so I will have to wait for feedback to see how successful this was as its brand new. Most still use the on-line services as it is much faster and can cover the bulk of general needs. E-FILE Now Up to 7 Years Back and Heading to 10 Years Soon



Good news for clients behind on taxes is we can now E-file as far back as 2017, or six years. <u>These portals will remain open</u> <u>until it reaches the 10-year mark</u>, so 2026 will be the first year 10 years can be e-filed. Also, we can currently download slips back to 2014, when that service started 8 years ago, and I believe once that reaches the ten-year mark in 2023, that will close off slips before the 10-year mark. On-line adjustments currently only go back 4 years but stay tuned to see if that is allowed to follow the same pattern!

Uncovers Bust of IRS's Use of AI to Spy on Americans' Bank Accounts



In a shocking and unsurprising expose of America's IRS, <u>James</u> <u>O'Keefe of OMG Media</u> last month delivered a bone chilling reveal of <u>how the Internal Revenue Service really works</u>. An undercover journalist sat down with Alex Mena, who works in the Criminal Investigations Unit for the IRS and was told about egregious practices they engage in, including viewing Americans' bank accounts whenever they went through AI technology, targeting the average American because they can, and not having a problem with putting anyone in prison for whatever reasons they conclude are worthy of such a punishment. Does CRA follow similar practises? Time will tell.

February 6 Economic Plan Offers Some Spending Relief



Last month's <u>Economic Plan</u> announced rent support to low-

income renters, more emergency shelter spaces, and plans to make groceries more affordable. A \$99 million national top-up to the <u>Canada Housing Benefit</u> making rent more affordable and \$100 million in emergency winter funding to provide more shelter spaces for people experiencing homelessness. Also federal funding for <u>Canada's Contributions Program</u> for nonprofit consumer and voluntary organizations to investigate, reveal price inflation/harmful business practices, such as shrinkflation/skimpflation in the grocery sector, as well as other forms of corporate greed that have increased the prices Canadians pay for everyday goods. <u>Knowledge Bureau has a</u> <u>detailed article</u> about this announcement.

New Canada Carbon Rebate Amounts and More for 2024-25



Last month CRA announced the new

<u>Canada Carbon Rebate payment schedule</u> for eligible provinces. Starting at \$380.00 for a single person in New Brunswick up to \$2,160.00 annually in Alberta. Knowledge Bureau has <u>several articles</u> including <u>payment details</u> and <u>polling data</u>, <u>public reaction</u> about the credits. Overall, the public rejects the idea of a carbon tax and feel the need to remove it all.

New \$10 Million Capital Gains Exemption on Business Succession



As of January 01st, 2024 business owners will be able to sell their businesses to their employees through an EOT -Employee Ownership Trust. According to a Knowledge Bureau article, the plan features some interesting twists from the usual incentives, which include a capital gains exemption of just over \$1 Million on the sale of Qualifying Small Business Corporations, Farms, or Fishing Properties. Under usual rules, taxpayers who receive a shareholder loan must include the loaned amount in income in the year the loan is received, unless the loan is repaid within a year. Legislative proposals introduce an exception to these rules, which will be made to extend the shareholder loan repayment period from one to 15 years for amounts loaned to the EOT from a qualifying business to purchase shares in a qualifying business transfer. Unfortunately, the legislation has not yet anticipated changes to the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT) carry forward rules, which still sit at only 7 years.

New Taxology Podcast by CRA

First Home Savings Account (FHSA) Now on 2023 Tax Return



The First Home Savings Account (FHSA) will

now have a deduction on the 2023 personal tax return under line 20805, <u>5000-S15 Schedule 15 - FHSA Contributions</u>, <u>Transfers and Activities</u>. If you open an FHSA in 2023, you can claim up to \$8,000.00 to a lifetime limit of \$40,000.00 in FHSA contributions you made by December 31, 2023. <u>Knowledge</u> <u>Bureau has a detailed article</u> about this new provision.

Underused Housing Tax Still Complex



For those who've been getting my newsletters for at least a year, I've tried

to keep you up to date as best as possible regarding the rules of the <u>Underused Housing Tax (UHT)</u>. The UHT is an annual federal 1% tax on the ownership of vacant or underused housing in Canada that took effect on January 1, 2022 and residential property owners that are affected have until April 30, 2024 to file their returns and pay the tax for the 2022 calendar year without being <u>charged penalties or interest</u>. Many homeowners, accountants, and those in the real estate business are trying to make sense of these rules, but like that old Led Zepplin song, are <u>"Dazed and Confused." Knowledge</u> <u>Bureau has a detailed article</u> to try and make it make sense.

First Time Home Buyer Incentive "Quietly" Cancelled



The 5 year old CMHC <u>First-Time Home</u>

<u>Buyer Incentive Program silently wound down this month</u>. According to a <u>CBC article</u>, the program was hampered in part by eligibility issues, including limits to household income and the size of a mortgage the buyer could take on. In a nutshell, the program makes it easier for you to buy a home and lower your monthly mortgage payments via shared equity instrument. It works by getting an extra 5% or 10% of the down payment of the property and then repaying the government either 5% or 10% of the property's market value at the time of repayment. No new approvals will be granted after March 31, 2024.

2024 Tax Filing Deadline

The deadline is now 37 days for most personal returns, and there is no talk of an extension this year. Waiting until the last minute to get your taxes done is never a good idea; especially if you need it assessed soon. Once you are ready



to file your 2023 return, plan TODAY rather than April 29th. I am jammed to the rafters with appointments, and you may have to wait weeks before getting a chance. Take advantage of our email, fax, phone, or mail service. Make sure you <u>authorize us</u> if you have not already done so or are a new client. The days of office locations and 9-5 hours are really becoming a thing of the past, and regrettably businesses stuck in yesterday's perception will get left there. Most clients are demanding more options and no surprise appointments are no longer necessary!
