### Thanksgiving Message

Dear Clients and Friends,

Another summer has passed by us, and we are having a warm fall so far here in Southern Alberta after records of summer heat waves. The mountains still do not have much snow and we need the moisture badly, so hoping for large dumps soon.

Friends, it's time to wake up now! There's never been a time in history when the world is finally pushing back against the deep state agenda of globalism. ### 2021 Tax Service Now Available


As some of you were alerted to in the summer, 2021 tax preparation service is now available. Those who have all their information or are filing zero income can take advantage of this service and avoid the rush. You can also get the paperwork yourself from the forms website. Unfortunately most will have to wait until early March 2022 when they have all their T-slips, etc. One of the bonuses is the 2021 calculations are also available (of course based on the current information) so, for example, if a client foresees a sizable amount of money coming from a buyout with the option to defer, it's always recommended they book a consultation to utilize the most tax advantageous strategy. 
### Today's Youth Will Pay For Yesterday's Debt Tomorrow


Recent budget expenditures are placing high tax burdens on youth entering the work force. According to

Sometimes fishing letters go out to trick people into admissions which were not required but, according to a <a href="Fasken Law article">Fasken Law article</a>, here are the ones to look out for: Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy ("CEWS") Applications, Gains or Income from Cryptocurrency Transactions, Transfer Pricing Transactions, Transactions Involving Treaties, GST/HST Avoidance and Evasion, Tax Evasion Involving Trusts and Shareholder Benefits. That's quite a list and technically it can cover almost everybody for everything in this country but we must wait at least one tax season to see how much actually happens.

# Claiming Quarantine Hotel Costs and COVID Testing

Many who were unexpectedly quarantined in hotels for testing positive for COVID were often stuck



with bills for thousands of dollars. While the testing should be deductible under current legislation, unfortunately the hotel costs aren't, according to a recent article by Knowledge Bureau. Don't throw those receipts out as there may be enough push from the public for policy changes to allow this claim. Much of the COVID pandemic is not settled yet and it's up to the people to insist this is deductible, so contact your MP about this.

and my wife and I haven't worked in years. Is CRA actively requesting this money back? We can't

seem to get a straight answer anywhere and friends of ours are in similar situations anxiously waiting.

Dear Steve W.,

It seems to be an enigma since much of CRA employees are still working out of their homes with no expected date of return. With over 45,000 employees and pending vaccination mandates, it's hard to tell what their future is if many lose their jobs for refusing the vaccine. There are instances where CRA has back tracked on their own rules with the recipient keeping \$5,000.00. There seems to be audits going on for previous claims but, on the other hand, there is an expansion of worker's benefits. I have heard through various meetings that CRA collections has started to talk to people but I don't know if any enforcement actions have been taken. You can check out the COVID 19 website for updates but my conclusion is there's no official word on the street CRA has executed any type of reclamation of these payments so far. Good Luck!
